







LOW SOCIO-ECONOMIC GROUPS

Those from low socio-economic backgrounds are less likely to do any kind of volunteering than those in Higher socio-economic backgrounds. 20.3% of Bolton residents are living in the lowest 10% LSOA and 36.4% of Bolton residents are in the NS SEC 6-8.

LONG TERM HEALTH CONDITIONS/ DISABILITY

19.8% of people in Bolton have a long term health condition or disability, compared to 17.6% in England and 19.43% in GM. People with long term health conditions are more likely to informally Volunteer. 24.7% of Bolton residents have high anxiety, currently only 9% of people benefiting from the VCSE sector having poor mental health.

ETHNICITY/ FAITH GROUPS

6% of the current VCSE organisations operate in Faith Groups, of those who benefit from the work, 8% Are from ethnic backgrounds. Great Lever has high levels of BAME residents and is a key Focus of work for the LP and for the VCSE sector. Within Bolton 11.7% of residents are Muslim and 2.16% are Hindu, which is higher than both England and GM. The Asian population is 14.0%.
